GALLANTRY CITATION IS AWARDED

A LOCAL veteran has been presented with a unit citation.

John Kenihan, who lives in the Sale area, received the citation for gallantry for the Battles of Fire Support Bases Coral and Balmoral.

Gippsland MHR Darren Chester said Mr Kenihan was a national serviceman who served with the Australia Army from February1967.

"John was deployed to Vietnam in December that year with the 1st Independent Armoured Squadron Workshop, which was later re-designated as the 1st Armoured Regiment," Mr Chester said.

"During his deployment, John participated in the Battles of Fire Support Bases Coral and Balmoral in May and June of 1968.

"He returned to Australia in October 1968 before his discharge a month later.

"There's no greater contribution that anyone can make to our nation than to put on a uniform to service their country.


"It is one of the great honours and privileges of my position as the responsible minister to thank these brave men and women on behalf of the nation."

The citation is among a number of awards Mr Kenihan has already received, including the Vietnam Medal, Australian Active Service Medal 1945-1975 with a Vietnam clasp, and the Australian Defence Medal.

The Unit Citation for Gallantry for the Battles of Fire Support Bases Coral and Balmoral is awarded in recognition of the extraordinary gallantry displayed by members of the 1st Australia Task Force (Forward) and associated units, including the 1st Armoured Regiment which was deployed to Area of Operations Surfers between May 12 and June 6, 1968.



Endurance Test, Sunday 7th July 2019 Around Lakes Guthridge and Guyatt

What is an Endurance Test? Can you ride a bike at the same time as controlling your dog on the end of a loose two-meter lead, or are you a runner who will be quite happy to run 20kms with your dog? If so, then read on.

You must be able to train your dog to run alongside you whilst you jog the distance, ride a bicycle or use any other form of non-motorised mechanical vehicle with the dog, provided the required speed is maintained. (Motor cycles or cars will not be permitted).

Experience has shown that you do not need to cover long distances during training, frequent runs over shorter distances, gradually building the dog's fitness is the way to go.

The endurance test is over 20kms & is split into three sections, the first being eight kilometres. The second & third are six kilometres. There is a break of 15 minutes between the first & second sections & 20 minutes between the second & third sections. All this is carefully watched over by a judge.

The dog's fitness & condition is monitored by designated vetting teams who examine each dog during the breaks. Any person entering an ET must supply a certificate from their vet confirming the dog's fitness to take part. You do not have to worry about your dog's ability to continue during the test, as it is being constantly checked. At the beginning, & before any running takes place, the designated vetting teams will check each dog and compare the data on the certificate supplied on entry with its current condition. If all is **OK** the judge will give the handler and dog a very simple obedience test to check its willingness to obey.

The Endurance Test itself is carried out at a speed of 10kms per hour or one kilometre every six minutes. This is really a very gentle jog for cyclists or runners and most dogs enjoy gaiting at this speed. The whole test takes two hours and 35 minutes including the intervening breaks. During the breaks & again 15 minutes after the end of the 20kms the vets will check your dog's condition. After the final vet check, there will be a repeat of the simple obedience test to prove your dog is just as willing to obey as he was before the ET began.

THE CLUB WILL BE HOLDING IT'S 9TH ENDURANCE TEST ON SUNDAY 7TH JULY 2019.

The Endurance Test is open to all breeds of dogs that are Dogs Victoria registered and whose owners are Dogs Victoria members. All handlers, if not the owner of the dogs, must also be members of Dogs Victoria. Dogs must be over 2 years of age and no older than 8 years of age.

Check in: 0700-0715

Judging time: Commences at 8:00am sharp

Handlers may jog the distance, ride a push bicycle or tricycle or one powered by battery, provided the required speed is maintained.

Cyclists must wear helmets.

Dogs must compete wearing fixed collars or harnesses, no chains.

Please include a stamped self-addressed envelope for return of Veterinary certificate.

Please indicate on entry form if you will be cycling or running.
